Entry Fees:

Ontario Water Polo Club Championships \$630.00 (\$600.00 plus \$30.00 GST)

Technical Foundations Entry Fees: \$420.00 (\$400 plus \$20.00 GST)

- **Late entries may be accepted IF space is available in the tournament. A \$105.- (\$100 fee plus \$5 GST) will be charged for all late team entries.**



Team Registration Procedures:

The OWP Club Championship fees are payable to Ontario Water Polo and are to be sent to the OWP office at: Ontario Water Polo, 3 Concorde Gate, Suite 206, Toronto, Ontario, M3C 3N7
Each club will complete and submit one club entry form per deadline date (January 22nd and/or March 26th). This form and the OWP Club Championship fees and are due in the OWP office on the Entry Deadlines dates.

Team Rosters:

- ✓ All OWP member clubs must fill out the roster form on line database system. Club admin access is required.
- ✓ To ensure roster names are in the tournament program all teams are requested to submit their roster with the club entry form on, or before, the **ENTRY** deadline. The **FINAL ROSTER** deadline is to ensure all team members are listed and the **FINAL ROSTER** will be used for checking rosters on site at the Club Championship.
- ✓ All non-OWP member clubs must fill out the roster form (see appendix) and have their PSO or National Federation approve the roster prior to submitting their roster to the OWP office.

LATE ROSTERS:

Clubs that do not submit rosters prior to the Roster Deadline will be charged \$100.00 (plus GST). Only athletes who are members in good standing of their club at the roster deadline may be added to the team roster.

Clubs wishing to add names to their roster after the roster deadline can appeal for the name(s) to be added. A non-refundable appeal fee of \$50 (plus GST) will be charged to any club making an appeal. Appeals must be received prior to 12 noon on the Wednesday preceding the event.

Appeals must be sent to info@ontariowaterpolo.ca.

The appeal letter should include the reasons for the athlete being left off the initial roster.

2010 OWP Club Championships Rules

Each OWP Club Championship in 2010 may have certain rules that are necessary due to facility constraints and in the Spirit of Sport and promotion of our sport. These will be sent to the tournament committee and participating teams prior to the event.

1. TOURNAMENT or EVENT

Some OWP Provincial Championships have two *Tournaments* occurring at the same *Event*. (i.e. Senior AA men and Senior AA women will be two tournaments at the one event.) This distinction is important for rulings and discipline procedures.

2. LENGTH OF GAME

To better prepare OWP member clubs for National Club Championships we will attempt to play all Provincial Championship events that lead to a National Championships by the age group rules of the National Championships. Please see the WPC National Championship Handbook for game lengths.

3. PLAYER CHANGES

For clubs with more than one team in the same tournament, a maximum change of two players from one roster to their other roster will be permitted. This will be allowed up to the pre-competition meeting. If the event does not have a pre-competition meeting all changes must be done 30 minutes prior to the first game of the Event.

This can be done onsite by submitting the change to OWP representative or tournament host.

(NOTE – CHANGES NEED TO BE MADE PRIOR TO THE FIRST EVENT GAME NOT THE TEAMS FIRST GAME)

4. PLAYER ELIGIBILITY

Only OWP competitive members may compete on a team that is eligible to win the Provincial Championships.

Players competing in an OWP Club Championship event must be of the same gender and age grouping (or younger) of the assigned competition. Athletes who are not of the age or gender will be deemed an illegal participant.

PLEASE NOTE: If a female athlete participates in any male championship she will become ineligible for all female championship events in the current program year. Once a female athlete competes in a 2009-10 championship she may only play in that gender category for the remainder of the year.

5. COACHING ELIGIBILITY STAFF CHANGES/ADDITIONS:

Coaching Staff changes or additions must be made at, or prior to, the pre-competition meeting.

If the event does not have a pre-competition meeting staff changes must be made prior to the start the teams first game.

If a coach is being added to a roster the club/team will need to show proof this member is a current member in good standing of OWP and NCCP 'Make Ethical Decision' certified. Only Active Registered and Certified coaches who appear on the team roster may sit on the team bench and actively coach during the tournament.

All coaches, Head Coach and all Assistant Coaches, must have successfully completed the online evaluation of Making Ethical Decisions (MED). Workshops are held by the Ontario Coaches Association, while the evaluation must be done online at www.coach.ca, it is not necessary to register for the workshop, coaches whom feel confident enough may take the online evaluation directly.



Any Team having a coach that is not certified with MED and participates in any game will be charge a fine of \$25 per game or \$50 per day

6. LOANS of, or SECONDARY MEMBERS

- No Secondary members who have primary membership in another club may compete on any team that is eligible to win the provincial championships. In short there are no transfers/loans allowed. (clarification on Secondary members in appendix #2)
- An athlete must be a primary member of the club he/she is representing at least 30 days prior to the Championships Entry Deadline. This rule does not apply to new OWP/WPC* members.
- Athletes that are members of another Water Polo Canada Provincial governing body may compete on an Ontario team that is eligible to win the Senior Club Championship ONLY IF they are attending an Ontario Post Secondary School. In this case, the OWP team/club they are participating with in the tournament is in the same city or is the closest club/team to the school he/she is attending.
- OWP member athletes who attend an Ontario Post Secondary School may compete on an Ontario team that is eligible to win the Senior Club Championship providing the:
 1. OWP team/club they are participating with in the tournament is in the same city or is the closest club/team to the post secondary school he/she is attending.
 2. OWP team/club they are participating with in the tournament is the same club they were a member of prior to attending the post secondary school.

7. ROSTERS and Bench control

HEAD COACH and COACHES

- ⇒ Each team must only list ONE Head coach. A coach can only be a Head coach of one team per *tournament*. A coach can be on more than one roster during the tournament.
- ⇒ If a coach receives a RED CARD he/she will serve a one game suspension. If warranted the tournament protest committee can increase this suspension.
- ⇒ If a coach receives a RED CARD he/she can only serve the game suspension with the team he/she was coaching at the time he/she received the card. This coach will NOT be allowed to participate in the event with any team that he/she is on the roster for at the Tournament or Event until the suspension is served. If it is the last game of the tournament for the team that the RED CARD was obtained the suspension will carry forward to the next Ontario Club or WPC National Club Championship tournament, which ever occurs first.
- ⇒ Officials and the protest committee should recognize that coaches at provincial championships may still be actively teaching athletes and not overly concern themselves with WPC 'radio commentator rules. (Please see RIC Instructions for further information)

TEAM COMPLEMENT

A team may dress an unlimited number of players provided that each player has his/her own individually numbered water polo cap on (no team bench may have duplicate cap numbers). All players must appear on the team roster form prior to the stated roster deadline as described in this document.

A team may have a maximum of three (3) staff (all of whom *should* wear a common "team uniform") that are permitted to sit on or near the team bench, all of whom must appear on the team roster form. Only individuals listed on the team roster submitted prior to the tournament may be on or near the team bench, on the pool deck or actively coach the team.

OWP will use the FINA guidelines for bench control at all Ontario Club Championships (* except for all 14+Under Championships, see appendix 1) as it pertains to where the coaches may be during the game.



Assistant coaches may communicate with athletes on the bench and during the play. However assistant coaches must remain on the bench and will not communicate with the athletes in the water during the play of the game. Team Medical Staff are not counted in the three (3) staff rule. However Medical staff may NOT actively coach or not sit on the bench during the game if the team has three staff present. Team Medical staff must also be registered with OWP and on the tournament roster.



8. BRUTALITY/DISRESPECT/VIOLENCE or RED CARDS

Athletes committing an act of Brutality, Disrespect or Violence during the game will be assigned an automatic one (1) game suspension.

Coaches or staff that receives a RED CARD during the game will be assigned an automatic one (1) game suspension.

The Tournament Committee can also review any incident to determine if any additional action is required to be taken at the event. The decision of the Tournament Committee is final and is in affect until the end of the event.

The tournament director must file a report to OWP office within 48 hours of the completion of the event.

9. GROSS MISCONDUCT

OWP and all member clubs will not tolerate any physical or verbal abuse toward the officials, coaches, players, OWP staff/representatives, or the tournament organizers of any event sanctioned by OWP.

All incidents in violation of OWP behavior standards that occur outside of the game or field of play will be viewed as Gross Misconduct.

Gross Misconduct incidents can also occur prior to, during or immediately following an actual game. The Tournament Discipline Committee can automatically warrant a tournament suspension to the offender guilty of Gross Misconduct.

All incidents of Gross Misconduct will be referred to an OWP Discipline Committee. Further sanctions could apply.

The decision of the Tournament Committee is final and is in affect until the end of the event.

The tournament director must file a report to OWP office within 48 hours of the completion of the event.

OWP Discipline Committee will consist of the Vice President of OWP (or designate), an OWP board member (or designate) and a third person selected by OWP executive. This meeting will be held within TWO working days of receiving the incident report

10. TOURNAMENT RULES

When the OWP releases the final schedule a set of tournament rules could also be sent out. These rules are designed to uphold the Spirit and Best Interest of the championships.

The Spirit and 'Best Interest' of the event

After consultation and agreement the Tournament committee (RIC, Tournament Director and OWP Representative) will be allowed to make decisions on-site that are in the 'best interest' of the event and its participants. These adjustments may include; a delay in game start time to accommodate a traveling team, allowing a team to start a player short if others have been delayed, etc. Such adjustments must have due cause (i.e. weather, etc). Due to the logistics of tournament play, it may be necessary to adapt rules that will allow for greater participation and consistency within the event.

Championship Awards

TEAM AWARDS

- i) A banner will be provided by OWP and presented by the tournament organizers, OWP representative or VIP. This banner is awarded to the highest placing Ontario Team eligible to win the Championship.
 - ii) The Championship trophy (if one is to be presented) will be delivered by OWP to the Host representative (the prior winning team will return the Championship trophy to OWP by January 1st in good condition which will involve polishing and up to date engraving). This Trophy is awarded to the highest placing Ontario Team eligible to win the Championship.
 - iii) OWP will provide the host with medals for the players and team staff on the gold, silver and bronze medal teams. OWP Championship Medals will only be presented to the eligible Ontario Teams and eligible teams from another province or FINA partner.
- A maximum of fifteen (15) medals per team will be provided. Additional medals may be purchased by the winning clubs at cost from OWP.

- Senior championships will not have individual medals presented
- Technical Foundation events will have participant awards and no placement awards.

INDIVIDUAL AWARDS

- A. 1 Most Valuable Goalie Award (Selected by tournament committee – presented to an OWP athlete)
- B. 1 Most Valuable Player award (Selected by tournament committee – presented to an OWP athlete)
- C. ALL ONTARIO TEAM:
FOR TOURNAMENTS OF 6 (six) OWP teams or less AND at all Senior championships
* 7 tournament All-Star awards (1 goalie and 6 field players selected by tournament committee and referees. Only OWP athletes are eligible for selection).
FOR TOURNAMENTS of 7 (seven) OWP or more teams
* 14 tournament All-Star awards (first team and second team with 1 goalie and 6 field players selected by tournament committee and referees. Only OWP athletes are eligible for selection).
- D. TEAM Offensive and Defensive awards for each participating team (as selected by the team coach)

Please note: Any player cited for disrespect, misconduct or brutality is not eligible for their Team Offensive or Defensive award, the Most Valuable awards or tournament All-star teams

GAME THREE STARS:

The Host must announce the Three Stars following each game and post the selections in a central public place throughout the event.

Athletes selected for the Three (3) Stars should display the following qualities during the game:

- superior offensive and defensive skills
- positive leadership and sportsmanship displayed
- invaluable contribution to the team's overall performance

Selection of Referees

- ✓ The OWP Officials Enhancement committee will send the dates and locations of the Club Championships to all officials/referees registered as competitive members of Ontario Water Polo.
- ✓ Any referee interested in participating must reply with the tournaments they are available to attend.
- ✓ The Officials Enhancement committee will compile the list and select officials and the Referee in Chief (RIC) for all OWP Club Championships.
- ✓ The Tournament RIC will assign all games for the Championship.
- ✓ The RIC will ask coaches for input for the referee assignments for the medal games.



Penalties, Forfeits and other Infractions

Ontario Water Polo Penalties that may apply if the above rules are not adhered to:

- i) Removal from the area of competition
- ii) Loss of game(s) 5-0
- iii) Non-acceptance of entry
- iv) Probation as a member in good standing
- v) Forfeit of entry fee
- vi) \$1,000 performance bond
- vii) Fines
- viii) Declared a member in bad standing
- ix) Ineligible for participation in the medal round
- x) Other sanctions

Specific sanctions which will be applied against the following infractions, when applicable:

i) A team not having a chaperone (when required) during an event:

In the case where the discrepancy is discovered on site at the event; the following sanction must apply:

- A team not providing a chaperone must pay a fifty dollar (\$50.00) penalty plus an amount equal to the total cost that would have been incurred by the team had it provided the appropriate individual, from the respective team's home city.

ii) A team which drops out after the deadline. The following sanctions must apply:

- Forfeit entry fee
- A Five Hundred Dollar (\$500.00) performance bond will be requested from the club prior to participation in any future Championships including the current year.
- This bond will be returned after full participation in the next event.

In addition to the aforementioned sanctions, the following fines will also apply:

A team that withdraws:	14 - 7 days prior	\$100 fine
	7 - 2 days prior	\$350 fine
	less than 48 hours	\$700 fine

The fine is payable to Ontario Water Polo before any other teams from that club can participate in any sanctioned event. The club will be declared in bad standing until the fine is paid.

iii) A team participates in a game with a non-registered or an illegal member (illegal as defined by FINA rules or due to not being a part of the roster) the following sanctions must apply:

- A non-registered, or otherwise illegal, player, coach, or manager cannot take part in any game.
- A team using non-registered, or otherwise illegal athletes, coaches and/or managers shall lose by a score of 5-0 for each game in which the team uses such illegal participants.

v) If a team commits any infraction with the intention of gaining an advantage (e.g. use of non registered, illegal participants; forfeiting a game for the purpose of gaining or making another team gain a better ranking), the following sanction will apply:

- The team cannot take part in the medal round.
- The team shall lose by a score of 5-0 for each game in which they have intentionally tried to gain an unfair advantage.



APPENDIX #1

Additional Rules for the 14 + Under 'AA' Coed Club Championships

No holding away from the ball:

This rule will be strictly enforced on the perimeter of the umbrella and on the counter attack. The OWP Technical committee would like to encourage coaches and clubs to play with motion and skill while increasing the enjoyment of the game for all athletes and fans. Play in the 'HOLE' will still have players contesting for position and therefore making contact. However, the onus of showing positive body position and technique will be placed on the athletes. Excessive contact will be called an ejection or an offensive foul.

An athlete can only play 50% of the game as a goalie

For the simple administration of this rule the following formula will be used:

Any athlete that plays in any part of any quarter will be deemed to have played 25% of the game as the goalie.

Three major fouls will NOT result in the athlete from being excluded from the game.

The philosophy of fair play, everyone plays and expansion of the game requires the buy in of the coaches, athletes, parents and clubs. This rule eliminates the safety net of having additional players on the bench in case of fouling out is not warranted.

If the Referee determines a player or coach is abusing the spirit of this rule they will be removed from the game and a disrespect call will be made. *(please see DISRESPECT rules on page #6)*

Zone/drop defences will NOT be permitted

The rationale of this rule is to encourage one on one skills for offensive and defensive players. Coaches can often manipulate the game at this level by implementing tactical solutions to solve a lack of skill, fitness or exploit weaknesses in their opponents.

If a team or an individual player is playing a drop or zone defence the REFEREE can:

- Remove the ball from the pool give the defensive team (coach and if applicable the offending player) a warning and reset the Shot Clock.
- Penalize the player by giving a regular 20 second penalty.
- Give the defensive coach a YELLOW and/or RED Card.
- Penalize the player by giving a disrespect penalty. *(please see DISRESPECT rules on page #6)*

The signal the referee will give when calling any of the above will be crossing their arms over their chest.

PLEASE NOTE - Players can drop onto another player after committing a minor foul on the player with the ball.

Coaches can not act as radio commentator.

Let the athletes play. Any coach who is overly active in providing players instructions will be warned by either one of the referees, the RIC, or the OWP representative. If the coach does not follow the warning a Yellow or Red card can be issued by either the OWP representative, the RIC or either one of the game Referees.



APPENDIX #2

Player Transfer/Secondary Member Rules for 2010 Ontario Club Championships

Explanation and Rationale

Please find below the transfer rule for provincial championships along with a brief explanation of the rationale for this rule and how it will be enforced. It is not the intention of the OWP to limit the participation of members at its Ontario Club Championships, but instead this rule should be seen as an encouragement to put together true 'club teams' for our Ontario 'Club' Championships.

Rule as Passed by the Technical Committee and Board in 2005

All teams participating at an Ontario Club Championship in 2006 will be allowed only two transfer (or secondary) members from outside the club. For 2007 Ontario Club Championships this number will be reduced to one transfer (or secondary) member from outside the club. For Provincial Championships in 2008 and beyond there will be no athletes allowed to transfer teams for Ontario Club Championships.

Definition of Secondary member

OWP members can become a Secondary member of another OWP club that they *occasionally* participate with at training, games or events.

Rationale for this Rule

The intentions of this rule are to create a true 'Club' champion, increase participation and develop structurally strong clubs that will continue to grow our sport. It is our hope that this rule will:

- * Encourage more entries to the Ontario Club Championships - *teams will be more inclined to enter the championships on their own rather than just transferring athletes to another club in order to improve final placements if they know all other clubs are doing the same.*
- * Encourage new membership growth - *as clubs will need to recruit enough members to enter club championships at various categories.*
- * Encourage a higher degree of Member Retention from member clubs - *clubs will need to create quality programs that encourage competitive participation as their athletes progress in age.*
- * Stop the poaching / illegal recruiting of athletes.
- * Stop clubs from combining to serve their top athletes and not providing services/opportunities for new or lesser members.
- * Encourage cooperation amongst member clubs and trust amongst individuals.

Enforcement of the Secondary Member Rule

1. OWP will not permit a returning OWP (or WPC) member to participate at the Ontario Club Championships if they have a different primary club from the previous registration year. Exceptions will be given if the athlete has moved into a new region or has gone to another club within his/her region. (Note: In affect this will only result in a one year participation and only at OWP Club Championships)
2. UNATTACHED ATHLETES (please see below)



3. Requests For Exemption: Clubs that reside WITH IN the same region CAN apply for an exemption of this rule under the following circumstances:
- * Both (or all) demonstrate the need of not having enough athletes at the age + gender plus do not have appropriate level of athlete at the age group directly below the age/gender in question.
 - * All athletes from both (or all) clubs at the age and gender of the combining clubs are provided an opportunity to fully participate at the championship event.
 - * That both (or all) clubs have coaches involved in the championship event.
 - * That the name of the team at the event reflects the participants on the roster. No one club name will be used on the entry.
 - * The Combined club can win the event and the individual awards BUT they will not be declared Ontario Club Champion and therefore will not win the Club Championship Banner or Trophy. If this team is attending National Club Championships or the Ontario vs Quebec Challenge they will be ranked after all other Ontario Club Entries.

Ontario Water Polo Regions

- 1, Eastern Ontario (Ottawa to Kingston)
- 2, Western Ontario (Guelph, KW, London, St Mary's, Windsor)
- 3, Golden Horseshoe (Hamilton, Burlington, Brantford, Stoney Creek)
- 4, GTA (Durham, York Region, Peel, Toronto)
- 5, Ontario Open (Until these regions are further developed all other communities not listed above can request an exemption to join into any region or club that best fits their current needs)

UNATTACHED ATHLETES:

Athletes that belong to a club without enough athletes to enter a Club Championship can enter the event as an Unattached Athlete. If there are enough Unattached Athletes from various clubs they will form a team that will participate in the event but the UNATTACHED TEAM will not be allowed to win the championship banner.

*Clubs with Unattached athletes will be expected to assist with the coaching of the Unattached team during the event. More information on entering as an Unattached athlete will be made available in January 2010.

Appeal Procedure for Exemption of Secondary Members

- * All Appeals are sent to info@ontariowaterpolo.ca by Friday December 11th, 2009 for all championships except AAA 14U Boys and Girls which will be Friday February 5th, 2010.
- * The Appeal letter (see appendix # 3) must be copied to presidents and club head coaches of both clubs.
- * The Appeal will be sent to a committee of three members of the Technical Committee and/or Board of Directors.
- * The OWP office will advise head coaches and club presidents of both (all) clubs involved by Friday December 18th or Friday February 12th for the AAA 14U boys and girls. A notice will also be placed on the OWP website of the decision.



As stated earlier it is not the intention of this rule to limit any member of OWP the opportunity to participate at an OWP Club Championship. OWP is providing two additional and controlled methods that will allow all members to participate while still trying to promote true growth and expansion.

THESE RULES DO NOT APPLY TO ANY TECHNICAL FOUNDATION EVENT



Player Transfer/Secondary Member Rules for
2010 Ontario Club Championships (continued)

FAQs:

- 1. If an athlete that registers as a primary member with a club, but trains with another club on a regular basis.**

Which club are they eligible to participate with at provincial championships as a primary member?

To ensure club growth OWP would prefer that all athletes register with the club that they train with, however in the case that this does not occur, the athlete will be considered a member of the club that they are training with on a regular basis.

If it is brought to the OWP's attention that this is occurring then an observer may be sent to a club's workout to verify this, and if an athlete is training with another club they will be considered a member of the club they are training with for all age group Ontario Club championships.

- 2. If a club does not have enough athletes to field a team at a particular age group, and also does not have enough younger athletes to play up in order to fill the team for that age group. How can these athletes compete at their own Ontario championships?**

In this case clubs are asked to submit a list of the athlete names that wish to participate at the Ontario Club Championships.

This pool of athletes will either form one team eligible to compete at the championship, with a coach being offered by the athletes clubs. If this is not possible then this pool of athletes will be drafted by teams entered at the championship.

The rule has been made to encourage clubs, club coaches and parents to ensure their athletes, sons and daughters have teams and not concern themselves on how the 'other club' is 'stacking'.

- 3. What if a team has a secondary member on their roster?**

Any team that lists more than one non primary club member on their roster will be treated as playing an illegal player.

If a team does play an illegal player they will forfeit their all of their games.

- 4. Does this rule apply to all tournaments and events in Ontario or outside of Ontario?**

This rule is intended to ONLY be enforced at Ontario Club Championships.

Invitational tournament entries are governed by the individual clubs that host the events, and national championships have their own set of rules. The OWP has taken this approach as we would like to ensure that these championships are a true club championship and not a combination of clubs competing to combine teams faster than the others. We truly believe and hope that our member clubs do as well, that this is a positive step in promoting a fair playing field at provincial championships, and that it will also encourage greater numbers of athletes and clubs participating at the provincial championships.

*** PLEASE NOTE: The Secondary Member Rule does NOT apply to the 'AA' OWP open event.**
